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Summary: If medical error was a disease, it would rank as the third leading cause of death in the United States. Eighty percent of serious medical errors involve some sort of miscommunication. Using checklists to monitor each step of the healthcare process can have dramatic results in preventing adverse events. We need to shift our culture to create a more cohesive healthcare team by being accountable and accepting feedback. When everyone takes ownership for being a part of the team, our patients will have better outcomes.
