Webinar Description:

Enteral nutrition (EN) therapy is frequently utilized in hospitalized patients when oral intake is contraindicated or inadequate. This webinar will highlight EN practice recommendations for the use of EN in the oncology population. Attendees will gain knowledge and application for initiating EN in patients during their anti-cancer treatment process including those undergoing gastrointestinal cancer surgery and hematopoietic stem cell transplant.

Variability exists in practice as does controversy related to enteral nutrition (EN) initiation and use in oncology patients. When should EN be utilized in patients undergoing anti-cancer treatments; should patients with cachexia be considered for EN and what is the EN indication for those undergoing gastrointestinal cancer surgery and hematopoietic stem cell transplant are questions often asked by clinicians in the use of EN in oncology patients. These practice variations, controversies and questions will be addressed in the webinar.

Learning Objectives:

1. Describe when enteral nutrition is indicated in patients undergoing anti-cancer treatment.
2. Outline enteral nutrition use recommendations in patients requiring gastrointestinal cancer surgery.
