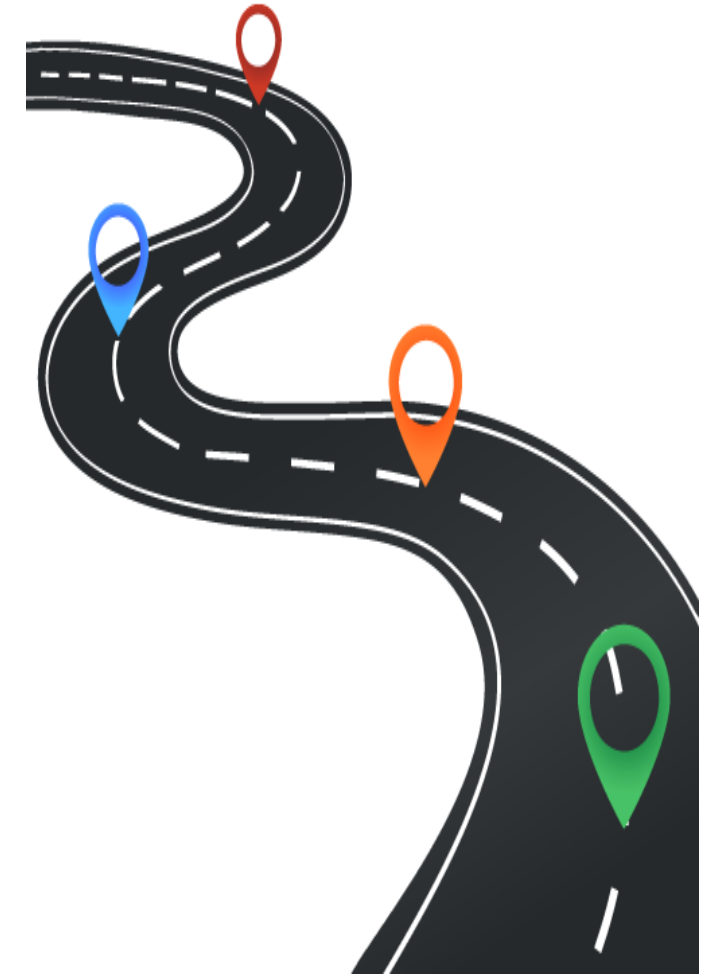

4. What information or education does the board need on the issue before discussion or decision-making?
5. What do we need to do to ensure the board is prepared? What role might committees or task forces play?



Tool: Board Meeting Agendas

- Agendas devised in partnership between board chair and CEO
- Ensure a focus on “big issues” and health center priorities
- Provide time for discussion, especially surfacing consumer and community perspectives
- Frame important strategic issues
